

Go Mobile - Without Killing Your Data

Steve Genung, CEO of MedAdvocate, one of our most important clients, created a solution, for Medicare's Chronic Care Management (CCM) and Transition Care Management (TCM) programs. Here it is the true story of how the medical industry can benefit from his solution:

"I recently spoke to a physician in Arlington, Virginia who said he was losing \$ 37,000 a year because he couldn't find someone to run his CCM and TCM programs for his Medicare patients.

He was truly distraught - I could see it in his eyes. He said that several physician group reps had come by, but they required him to join their group and he absolutely refused to do that. I told him that MedAdvocate allows you to remain independent. We just do the work for you.

He asked how MedAdvocate got started; I explained that after the new chronic care

codes were issued by the Center for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS) in 2015, I formed MedAdvocate and ran some trials with patients to determine what issues would arise in the course of providing these chronic care services.

Based on that experience and that of others in this industry, I created a methodology for ensuring the services are documented, auditable and reimbursed. We accomplished this by the end of the trail.

Now we are positioning MedAdvocate to serve health care providers nationwide. He wondered how long it would take to start making money. I told him he could be up and running within seven days and producing income with his

regular billing to Medicare.

He asked how much we thought he could realistically increase his income. I gave him an estimate, and we now know from actually providing his service that we increased his net income 37% -- \$43,476 per year (per provider).

I asked him if he used a certified electronic medical record (cEMR) in his practice. He did and knew it was required to bill for CCM. He said he had tried to do it himself but that his staff was busy, and when they did call patients it was irregular and it just never worked. I asked him how many people he added to staff to handle it. The answer? None.

I explained that we could coordinate his patient's care from our communications center in northern Virginia. We have registered nurses on duty 24-7 to cover the Clinical Advisory Services (CAS) required by CMS.

Our staff is trained to know how and when to contact patients, how to talk to them in order to get the information they need, and what to document in the EMR so that the provider is aware of issues and concerns. We initially assigned an ambassador to him who guided the

practice through initial training and setup.

As I left, he shook my hand and thanked me for enabling him to meet his financial goals and fulfill his obligations as the primary income earner for his family. "It's nice to have a such an easy track to run on and my daily patient hours have increased!"
